# **2020 CORTLAND COUNTY FAIR - GENERAL RULES**

- (a) All exhibits must be grown, made/prepared by the exhibitors since the last year's Jr. Fair.
- (b) **SHOW AGE GUIDELINES:** all classes are open to all youth:
  - (a) who were (8) eight years old, and have not passed their (19) nineteenth birthday as of January 1, 2020.
  - (b) Must be residents of Cortland County, regardless of affiliation with any organization, or who are members of any organization affiliated with Cortland County and who do not show at any other Junior Fair for this year.
- (c) <u>NEW YORK STATE FAIR AGE GUIDELINES</u>: youth participants must be at least (8)-eight years of age by January 1<sup>st</sup> of current club year and not have reached their nineteenth birthday prior to <u>January 1, 2020.</u>
- (d) A "CLOVERBUD" is allowed to show "one animal" per species in Showmanship classes only (animals required to be housed through the duration of the week). (as species specified):

♦Beef:	Not allowed
Dairy Cattle:	Spring Calf only
♦Dairy Goat:	Doe must be <u>younger than</u> <u>one year of age</u>
♦Meat Goat:	Doe or wether be <u>younger than</u> <u>one year of age</u>
♦Horse:	Leadline/Walk-trot classes only
♦Poultry	All breeds except Market Turkey & Market Broiler
♦Rabbit & Cavy:	All breeds
♦Sheep:	Animal must be <u>younger than one year of age</u>
♦Swine:	Not allowed

- (e) <u>A "FIRST YEAR SHOWPERSON</u>"(*Ist year showing in all animal classes*) youth participating in first showing see general rules age guidelines above, and the class listing in each animal division.
- (f) <u>PREMIUM CHECKS</u> Premiums to be paid as listed with respect to available funds. Checks will be distributed at the Fall 4-H Achievement Night Awards Recognition Program in October 24, 2020. Premium checks <u>must be cashed by</u> <u>December 31<sup>st</sup></u> of the current fair year; or they will be voided. \*\*It will be assumed that if the exhibitor has not cash their check, they wish to donate their <u>premium</u> <u>money to the Cortland County 4-H Fair Program</u>. \*\*\*The county will not issue a second check for lost checks. Fair premiums will be paid on a maximum of ONE ANIMAL entry per class, per exhibitor, <u>unless otherwise specified</u>.
- (g) <u>COMPLAINT OR PROTEST</u>: The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where error, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases the Superintendent or such referee as he may appoint may make decisions, or the case may be appealed to the

Agriculture Manager, whose decisions shall be final. All protests must be in writing and filed with the 4-H office within 4 hours of the conclusion of that show. The matter will be resolved by 4-H educators within 24 hours.

#### (h) **EXHIBITS RELEASE TIME:**

**ANIMALS – release time is between 6-8:00 AM – Sunday-July12th.** Any animals that leave the fairgrounds early will loose animal fair premiums and educator's endorsement to participate at NYS Fair. *Exception: Market Animals may be removed immediately after sale on Friday evening of the fair.* Please refer to release time on the fair schedule.

**4-H YOUTH BUILDING EXHIBITS** must remain in place until 6:00 a.m. the Sunday of the fair (July 12<sup>th</sup>). Exhibits that are left in the buildings will be collected and taken back to the 4-H office.

#### (i) <u>ANIMAL PRE-REGISTRATION FORMS</u> - **DEADLINE: JUNE 01, 2020.**

All animal entries **MUST BE PRE-ENTERED on-line** by exhibitor and/or their families.

- (i) <u>NON-OWNERSHIP CERTIFICATE</u> must be properly filled out, original to Cornell Cooperative Extension office, by JUNE 01, 2020.
  - NON-OWNED ANIMAL(s) accompanied with a non-ownership certificate must be properly filled out, along with registration papers to prove designation.
  - Beef, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep Swine -Youth are limited to ONE (1) nonowned animal per species at the fair.
  - Dairy Goats & Meat Goats Youth may register TWO (2) non-owned Animal per species- "but may only show one" at the fair.
  - Dairy Cattle: Youth are allowed TWO (2) non-owned dairy animals of which both can be shown, they must have met all the qualifications. Dual designation of animal(s) is not permitted. (NEW Exception-2020:) Dual ownership between siblings will be allowed as long as all of the following criteria are met: (A) They are bona fide siblings (sister, brother, step-sister/brother, half-sister/brother, adopted) (B) All siblings on registration paper of animal(s) are of 4-H age and regular 4-H members as of Jan. 1st of the current year.

  - A designated non-owned project animal must be shown <u>only by registered</u> <u>exhibitor</u> and not by youth owner and must accompany the animal entering the fairgrounds.
  - **Dual designation of one animal is not permitted (**except Dairy Cattle info on page 14).

The Danish Ribbon System Table

**ANIMAL PROJECT RECORD:** One project record is needed for one project animal that a youth has. If showing more than one species the 4-H'ers should only pick one animal. If showing a market animal, the market records will replace the project record. Try to finish project records as completely as possible.

- A continuous record should be kept on projects animals from one year to the next. Recording dates should start October 1<sup>st</sup> and end Sept 30 of the current 4-H year.
- Records for purchased animals should begin when that animal enters your herd, or for leased animals when the leasing period begins.
- The project ends the day the animal is sold.
- A complete project record must be submitted to the 4-H office no later than the Saturday of the Cortland Jr. Fair of the current 4-H year to receive fair premiums, and to be entered into County Medal consideration in the animal area a 4-H member has participated in.

### (j) All exhibits will be judged according to the complexity of the exhibit.

- New This year, the double entry card has been modified so, please make sure to fill both sides of the card out for Every exhibit in the 4-H Youth Building.
- Entries are marked down one placing if the card is not completed both sides.

#### Cloverbuds may dictate their process to complete both sides of the card. Double entry cards will be used for all "non-animal" exhibits, unless stated.

"GOOD" work will be given a RED ribbon "Good Award".
"CREDIBLE" exhibits will be given a WHITE ribbon "Worthy Award".

- (m) Showmanship classes WILL NOT receive premium points.
- (n) Superintendent may add, change or delete awards for any of the classes.
- (o) Each exhibitor must show his/her own animal, but during the course of the contest may be asked by the judge to show some other animal. Another youth may assist in group classes or multiple entries.



# IN MAKING AWARDS, THE JUDGES WILL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING

# 1. PREPARATION OF THE ANIMAL FOR SHOWING:

- (a) Condition of the feet and trimming of the feet;
- (b) Clipping of head, ears, tail, etc. (clipped properly for breed and sex)
- (c) Cleanliness and condition of the hide and hair.

# 2. SHOWING OF THE ANIMAL:

(a) Proper use of show equipment

- (b) Personal poise and control of animal
- (c) Skill in showing the animal to its best advantage
- (d) Personal appearance, neatness and cleanliness of the clothing of the exhibitor.
- 3. **APPOINTMENTS:** Dairy Cattle & Dairy Goats, <u>only plain white clothes</u> are to be worn. All entries <u>not meeting the above conditions</u> may be asked to return to the barn upon entry in the show ring.
- (o) The Dairy Cattle Barn will be open for 4-H to set up and move in on Monday, 7:00PM

#### <u>4-H MOVE IN DAY ~ TO DAIRY CATTLE BARN</u> TO RESPECT DAIRY CLASSIC SHOW FAMILIES WHO ARE MOVING OUT OF THE BARN AND CLEAN UP PROCESS – 4-H FAIR YOUTH WILL BE ABLE TO MOVE IN ON "MONDAY EVENING AFTER 7:00 PM" ALL ANIMALS MUST BE IN PLACE BY TUESDAY EVENING 6:00 P.M.

(p) Animals **must be in place** on Tuesday evening of fair week by 6:00 p.m.

#### ALL ANIMAL WILL BE RELEASED ON SUNDAY, JULY 14<sup>TH</sup> BETWEEN 6:00-8:00 A.M.

# CLEAN UP FOR THE BARNS - BEGIN AT 6:00 A.M. SUNDAY MORNING.

③ **ALL FAMILIES AND OR CLUBS MUST HAVE:(1)** <u>representative</u> - (*1-10 Animal Exhibits housed*) **or (2)** <u>representatives</u> (more than 10 animals) housed in "any barns" combined.

- **<u>RABBIT AND POULTRY CAGES</u>** All exhibitors must come on Sunday Morning during the clean up time and animal release schedule to scrub and wash cages & pens before dismantling and putting away. In past years, this has not been done and it will be <u>Mandatory Requirement</u> to be considered as part of showing your animals!
- (q) Any exhibitor withdrawing or exiting their animal or exhibit(s) prior to stated schedule for releasing from the fair will *forfeit all awards and premiums*. He/she will not be allowed to re-enter the exhibit at the county youth fair and will forfeit qualification to show at the NYS Fair 4-H Youth Shows.



- ALL BARNS CLOSE TO THE PUBLIC AT 10:00 P.M.
- EACH EVENING LIGHTS OUT BY 11:00 P.M.!
- NON-EXHIBITORS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO STAY IN THE BARN (UNLESS THEY ARE IMMEDIATE FAMILY)
- BACKGROUND CHECKS MUST BE DONE TO BE ABLE TO STAY OR TO BE A CHAPERONE FOR CLUBS ~ YOUTH AND FAMILIES.

**<u>A CODE OF CONDUCT FORM</u>** will require both child's and parent's signatures, for exhibitors. (a) 4-H'ers staying overnight must spend the night in the Dairy Barn location only. (b) Adults staying overnight must fill out and turn in a volunteer form and complete a back ground check.

<u>ALL exhibitors will be wearing wrist bands for the entire fair stay</u> and an overnight registration form will be available for parents/guardians and exhibitors to fill out for Safety and Emergencies and all **Barn close to the public at 10:00 p.m.**
