4-H Clubs



4-H Clubs come in all shapes and sizes, with members ranging from age 5-19. They learn and grow through regular meetings, trips, contests, projects, and fair events. Call Cornell Cooperative Extension of Cortland County for information on starting or joining a club.

Children ages 5-7 (as of January 1st) are considered Cloverbuds, who have special rules for projects and exhibits.

When clubs participate in annual fundraisers, profits support program and trip scholarships and a portion is returned to the club.



Independent Members

Independent 4-H members often pursue specific interests, complete projects, and participate in county and state fair.

They benefit from access to most of the same resources available to clubs. Annual fundraisers support program and trip scholarships for which they are eligible. Although they are self-directed, "independents" have countless opportunities to interact and learn with other 4-H members!

- Non-ownership options are available for youth who do not own an animal, but wish to work with, and exhibit one, at fair.
