SECTION 05 - MEAT GOATS (6PM) Wednesday, July 10th -Livestock Shows

HOUSING LOCATION: Rules and Regulations 2024 New York State Livestock Requirements & General Rules apply Age of Exhibitor

- (a) Boers and All Other Breeds all meat goat breeds in addition to Boers are encouraged to enter. All meat goats should be entered in the appropriate age classes and grouping; (fullblood/purebred or percentage) and will show together.
 - However, line up & scoring will be divided into Boers and "All Other Breeds". All other breeds will be judged according to the standards of their respective breeds and/or characteristics of an ideal meat goat breeding for market stock. Meat Goats do not need to be registered with a breed association. Full bloods and purebreds are does and doelings registered or eligible for registration as either purebreds or full bloods with a recognized meat goat breed. Unregistered meat goats must be tagged or tattooed with official scrapie identification. Registered meat goats should be tattooed and accompanied by registration papers.
- (b) Up to date Market records are mandatory for each animal.
- (c) No Bucks are allowed
- (d) Showmanship is required of all exhibitors.
- (e) All animal fitting must be done by youth exhibitor, ages 8 & up as of Jan 1 of current year. Adults may assist, but the majority must be done by the youth.
- (f) Exhibitor must have registration papers and/or non-owned certificate with the animal for Vet-check in to authorize entry and housing.
- (g) NON-OWNED ANIMAL(s) accompanied with a non-ownership certificate that is properly filled out, along with the animal's registration paper to prove identification. Youth are <u>limited to ONE (1) non-owned animal</u> per species at the fair. (i.e. Beef, Poultry, Rabbits, Swine & Sheep)

 - Youth may register **TWO** (2) <u>Non-Owned Animal per species</u>- "but may only show one" at the fair. (i.e. Dairy Goats & Meat Goats count as one species).
 - A designated non-owned project animal must be shown <u>only by registered exhibitor</u> and not by animal owner the designated youth exhibitor must accompany the animal entering the fairgrounds and during animal check in.
 - Dual designation of one <u>animal is not permitted</u>.
 - No Non-Owned Animal in the Market Class
- (h) ANIMAL PROJECT RECORD one project record is needed for one project animal that a 4-H'er has. If showing more than one species, the 4-H'er should only pick one animal. Website: http://cortland.cce.cornell.edu/4-h-youth/cortland-jr-fair
- (i) Market Sale Checks will be mailed to the meat goat exhibitor after fair, once exhibitor has met the four final requirements listed).
 - 1. Youth exhibitor must write, mail/and or hand-deliver a buyer letter to a minimum of three (3) potential buyers, inviting the potential buyer to the market animal auction. Youth must submit a copy of their buyer letter with their market animal entries by June 1st.
 - 2. Youth must complete and submit the Market Animal Record Book to the 4-H office by Friday, July 26, 2024.
 - 3. Youth must help dismantle/clean their area on Sunday, July 14th from 6-8 a.m.
 - 4. Youth must obtain their project's buyer information following the sale, then write a thank you letter, and submit the letter in an unsealed, stamped and addressed envelope to the 4-H office by Friday, July 26, 2024.
- (j) Premiums will be paid on a maximum of **ONE animal per class**, per exhibitor.
- (k) Entry Limit: (a maximum of 10 entries) per exhibitor will be permitted.
- (1) No farm shirts or any shirts with printing or design permitted in classes. Western wear is encouraged (i.e. neat shirts and dark jeans/pants). 4-H Club shirts are permitted in classes, but not in showmanship.
- (m) 4-H Club signs and displays encouraged.

- (n) Fans must be provided by Exhibitor for their animal's comfort.
- (o) The Ag Corp. building closes to the public at 10:00 p.m. Exhibitors are not permitted to stay in the Ag. Corp. building overnight.

In Place: Animals in place on Tuesday, July 9th by 6:00 p.m.

Released: All animals will be released on Sunday between 6:00-8:00 a.m.

- Market Kid- (age: 3½-months under 1-year) can be a doe kid or wether but will be judged as a meat animal and cannot show in any other classes except for showmanship classes. Any market kid under 50-pound weight cannot compete for Champion or Reserve Market Kid and will be considered in a feeder kids class. Market Sale Checks will be mailed to the sheep exhibitor after fair, once exhibitor has met the four final requirements listed).
 - Youth exhibitor must write, mail/and or hand-deliver a buyer letter to a minimum of three (3) potential buyers, inviting the potential buyer to the market animal auction. Youth must submit a copy of their buyer letter with their market animal entries by June 1st.
