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GENERAL PROHIBITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- No person shall bring or have present an animal on the fairgrounds for any reason (show, exhibit, raffle, demonstration, display) during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.
- Any animal which is subject to inspection upon entry to the fairgrounds will be inspected without covering (wraps, coats, head gear, etc.).
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.
- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to, or require removal from, the fair premises or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of, or exposed to, any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. NOTE: The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious, or communicable disease (Part 350.10). -The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.
- All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI)

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, deer, and misc. ruminants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. Wet ink signatures for paper CVIs or esignature for CVIs are acceptable.
- A physical CVI must be available to inspection staff for date and approval at time of inspection. This may be a printout of an CVI or owner's copy of a paper CVI.
- All animals must be officially identified. ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED. Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.
- Only one species is allowed per certificate.
- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

NEW YORK ORIGIN LIVESTOCK:

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI (see below).
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

Out of State Origin Livestock:

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- An e-CVI may be issued but a paper copy of the e-CVI is required for the animal check-in process.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a NY fair must be within 30 days of the date of CVI inspection. In order for the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION

- ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED
- Cattle must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. Sheep and goats must be identified by official scrapie identification (see sheep and goat sections below).
- Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. Nursing piglets originating within NYS do not have to be individually identified if the sow is correctly identified on the CVI and the number of piglets in the litter is noted on the CVI. Nursing piglets from out of state will need official ID (see swine section).
- Llamas and Alpacas must be identified by official ear tag or microchip.
- Misc. ruminants must be identified by unique ear tag or microchip.
- A complete written description is sufficient identification for horses entering New York accompanied by a CVI. The description must match the EIA test record. Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars, and other markings as necessary to uniquely identify the horse. Tattoos and microchips if any should be included. "Bay, no markings" is not an acceptable description for a CVI or EIA test record.
- NOTE: If you are exhibiting animals identified by microchip, a working reader must be supplied by the exhibitor.

RABIES VACCINATION

- **Rabies vaccination** is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair.
 - For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds.

- Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The exception is Imrab LA vaccine used in sheep which protects for 3 years after the second annual vaccination (consult your veterinarian).
- The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- NOTE: Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors. The New York State Fair requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds.

ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF RABIES VACCINATION

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the veterinarian administering the vaccine or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration, and the duration of immunity if longer than one year (sheep only).
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on a paper EIA test record, the test record must be signed certifying vaccination in addition to the required signature for the EIA test record.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is electronically entered into an EIA test record, only one electronic signature is required.
- NOTE: Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

BVD-PI Testing

• All cattle, llamas, and alpacas exhibited at NY county fairs, or the State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). Official ID must be in the animal prior to sampling. The testing veterinarian is responsible to make sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, official identification of the animal, and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

Cleaning and Disinfection

• All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).

Animal Deaths

 Occasionally animal deaths occur at a fair. If a death occurs, it must be reported to the state veterinarian in charge as soon as possible for review. The animal must be promptly removed from the public exhibit area to a secure location and held for the veterinarian prior to disposal.

Calving, Kidding, and Lambing

• Any cattle, goats, or sheep that calve, kid, or lamb while at a county fair or the State Fair will be ordered removed from the fairgrounds along with their offspring, unless the animals are part of a birthing demonstration.

Commingling of Sheep and Cattle

• Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is strongly recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

Commingling of Swine and Poultry

• Due to the potential spread of influenza virus, it is recommended that swine and poultry be housed in separate locations.

Isolation on Returning Home

• The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin. If any illness is noted in the exhibition animals, the owner should contact their veterinarian immediately.

INDIVIDUAL SPECIES REQUIREMENTS

<u>Horses</u>

 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is not required for New York origin horses. CVI is required for imported horses. Extended Equine CVIs (EECVIs) are acceptable. For more information on EECVIs, visit http://www.globalvetlink.com.

- Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test is required for all horses 6 months of age or older. The horse
 must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test record, signed by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
 The sample collection date for the qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2023, for New
 York origin horses. For imported horses, the EIA test must have been conducted within 12 months prior to
 entry. The EIA test certificate must include a complete description of the horse.
- Rabies vaccination within 12 months is required for all horses 4 months of age or older (see above).

<u>Cattle</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- Rabies vaccination is required for all cattle 4 months of age or older (see above).
- All cattle must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- All cattle must be vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with an age appropriate- product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the fair. The date and vaccine product should be documented.

<u>Sheep</u>

- **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** (CVI) with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> flock tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the sheep is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program, and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the sheep's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- Rabies vaccination is required for all sheep 4 months of age or older (see above).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the flock of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any sheep, the entire exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

<u>Goats</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1)USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the goat's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any goat, the entire exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

<u>Swine</u>

• Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with animals properly identified. Out of state nursing piglets need official identification along with the sow. See Animal Identification section above.

<u>Llamas and Alpacas</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- All llamas and alpacas must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

<u>Poultry</u>

- Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons, and waterfowl) must be accompanied by 1) results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition OR 2) proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock.
- Poultry qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- Proof of NPIP status must be in the form of an NPIP certificate or purchase receipt containing NPIP certification information. If utilizing a receipt, it must be dated within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Deer/Elk (Cervidae)

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- Originate from a herd classified as accredited or qualified under USDA tuberculosis regulations.
- A movement permit obtained from the Division of Animal Industry is required for all deer movements. All CWD and TB program requirements must be met before a permit will be issued. Questions regarding movement permits should be directed to the Division of Animal Industry at 518-457-3502.

Miscellaneous Ruminants

• Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.

EXHIBITOR PRE-FAIR GUIDELINES

Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas, and Alpacas, Cervids, Misc. Ruminants

- Review the animal health requirements booklet including information for your species before your veterinarian arrives to inspect your animals. If you have any questions, ask.
- Your veterinarian is responsible for inspecting your animals and completing the certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI). Call early to avoid the last-minute rush when mistakes are made and there is no time to correct.
- Make sure USDA approved official ear tags are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats. Official ID must be applied to animals prior to regulatory testing and completion of the CVI.
- Llamas and alpacas require a microchip or ear tag. If a microchip is utilized make sure the veterinarian confirms the microchip ID or places one. If your animal is identified by a microchip, make sure you bring a working reader with you to the fair.
- ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE RECORDED. Make sure it is.
- **Review the CVI carefully upon receipt** to make sure all the information is correct including any required test or vaccination information.
- DO NOT stuff it in an envelope and assume all is well. The time to correct is before pulling them out at the fair. The CVI is your document, and you share responsibility if it is incorrect.
- If you are importing livestock from out of state, make sure the interstate requirements are met and you have a valid interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.

<u>Poultry</u>

- If your flock is participating in the NPIP program, schedule pullorum flock inspection and testing well ahead of the fair.
- If you're having your birds tested within 90 days of the fair, you must go to a **pullorum clinic**. Available clinics are listed on the Dept. website. No individual testing is available if you miss a clinic.
- Birds qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- Bring documentation with you to the fair in the form of a 1) current NPIP certificate, 2) 90-day test chart or 3) purchase receipt with NPIP certification within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

<u>Horses</u>

- NY origin horses must be accompanied by a negative EIA test report. The date of sample collection for the qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2023.
- Imported horses (out of state origin) must be accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection with a negative EIA test within 12 months prior to entry. Rabies vaccination information can be incorporated into the CVI.
- Drawing or photograph must match the horse.
- Rabies vaccination must be within 1 year of arrival at the fair and be documented by a signed rabies certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart with the required information (see requirements).

MOST IMPORTANT When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork and official ID is present and legible. If they are showing any signs of illness, LEAVE THEM HOME.

CORTLAND COUNTY JR. FAIR ~ REGULATIONS 2024

- 1. OWNERSHIP: the exhibitor must own <u>all animals by JUNE 1st</u> of current fair year.
- 2. NON-OWNERSHIP & DOCUMENTATION: The exhibitor must care for animal(s) that are exhibited as non- owned no later than June 1st.
 - <u>Certificates are available</u> at the Cooperative Extension Office and online at <u>http://cortland.cce.cornell.edu/4-h-youth/cortland-jr-fair</u>
 - Certificates must be returned completed to the 4-H office by JUNE 1st along with a copy of the registration/ or identification papers.

3. ATTN: ALL YOUTH: ENROLLMENT & ANIMALS TO BE SHOWN:

- For current 4-H Members to show animals at the Cortland County Jr. Fair, they must re-enroll into Cortland County 4-H on or before <u>December 31, 2023</u>.
- For New 4-H member enrollment must be by June 1st, current 4-H year.
- For Market Animal Project new enrollment must be by March 1st, current year.
- 4. MARKET ANIMALS: must be owned and in the care of the Exhibitor by June 1st. of current 4-H Year or specified as below:

b) Beef:	180 days

GUIDE TO ANIMAL EXHIBITORS:

OWNED ~ VS ~ NON-OWNED ANIMAL PROJEC

 "OWNED": the animal is registered in the youth's name to be shown. "NON-OWNED" The animal is leased to the youth who does not own. (NOTE: A youth cannot own and still intend to also show a non-owned animal in the same species at the fair. Example: you cannot show an owned beef and a non-owned beef - but if the youth plan to show an owned beef; and a non-owned in sheep that is okay.
 A VALID HEALTH CERTIFICATE: Each animal must be individually & positively identified on the health chart (CVI) & must be issued by an accredited veterinarian. ON OR AFTER MAY 1 OF CURRENT

- YEAR
- 3. **IDENTIFICATION:** Animals must carry positive identification such as official ear tag, tattoo and/or registration papers. Make sure ear tags are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats.
- 4. **BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHEA-PERSISTENT INFECTION (BVD-PI)** The date and results of the testing must be noted on the CVI.
- 5. **PULLORUM-TYPHOID: (BIRDS)** <u>AFTER APRIL 10</u> (within 90 days) of Fair date. (doves, pigeons & waterfowl exempt).
- 6. **HORSE** EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANEMIA TEST (EIA/COGGINS) CALENDAR YEAR: 2023-2024 & 2024 Rabies

7. **RABIES VACCINATION:**

MARKET ANIMALS:

NON-MARKET ANIMALS:

<u>ON OR BEFORE JUNE 18, 2024</u> <u>ON OR BEFORE JUNE 25, 2024</u>

(NYS-AI-202 states) "Rabies Vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine is available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret and that are 4 months of age or older on the "<u>date of admission to the fair</u>" (see -Rabies requirement).

8. **RABIES VACCINATION OF ALL OTHER MAMMALIAN SPECIES:**

GOATS AND SWINE - will also be required even though there is no USDA licensed vaccine available; this is known as "off-label" use.

Exception to the Rule: will be given to only to the "*small, caged animal species",* such as rabbits cavies, etc. for which there is no USDA licensed vaccine available.

- Most animals must be at least 4 months of age to receive a rabies vaccine.
- Special precautions will be taken to inform and keep the public from coming in contact with all fair exhibited animals, especially those not rabies vaccinated, or off label vaccinated.
- All animals (with exception of those noted above) will be required to show proof.
- Rabies Vaccination. "ACCEPTABLE PROOF" IS A VALID RABIES CERTIFICATE and include all pets on the Cortland Fairgrounds property.

2024 CORTLAND COUNTY FAIR GENERAL RULES

(a) (b)

(C)

- All exhibits must be grown, made/prepared by the exhibitors since the last year's Jr. Fair.
- SHOW AGE GUIDELINES: all classes open to all youth:
 - Cloverbuds are ages 5 up to and do not turn 8 years of age after January 1, 2024).
 - 4-H members must be (8) eight years old and have not passed their (19) nineteenth birthday as of January 1, 2024.
 - Must be residents of Cortland County, regardless of affiliation with any organization, or who are members of any organization affiliated with Cortland Co.- who do not show at any other Junior Fair for this year.
- NEW YORK STATE FAIR AGE GUIDELINES: youth participants must be at least (8)-eight years of age by January 1st of current club year and not have reached their nineteenth birthday prior to January 1, 2024.
- (d) A CLOVERBUD (ages 5 up to 8) is allowed to show one animal per species in Showmanship class and breed class (animals required to be housed through the duration of the week).

(species specified for Cloverbuds to show): <u>2024 Cortland County Fair – General Rules</u>

- ♦Beef: Not allowed ♦ Dairy Cattle: Spring Calf only Doe must be younger than one year of age ♦Dairy Goat: ♦Meat Goat: Doe or wether be younger than one year of age Leadline/Walk-trot classes only ♦Horse: All breeds except Market Turkey & Market Broiler ♦ Poultry ♦ Rabbit & Cavy: All breeds Animal must be younger than one year of age, market lamb not allowed. - (e) <u>A FIRST YEAR SHOWPERSON (Ist year showing in all animal classes)</u> youth participating in first showing see general rules age guidelines above, and the class listing in each animal division.

(f) PREMIUM CHECKS - Premiums to be paid as listed with respect to available funds.

Cloverbuds will only receive ribbon recognition. Checks will be distributed to Youth ages 8-19 at the Fall 4-H Achievement Night Awards Recognition Program. Premium checks must be cashed by December <u>31st</u> of the current fair year; or they will be voided. ****The county will not issue a second check for lost** checks. Fair premiums will be paid on a maximum of ONE ANIMAL entry per class, per exhibitor, unless otherwise specified.

COMPLAINT OR PROTEST: The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where error, (g) fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases the Superintendent or such referee as he may appoint may make decisions, or the case may be appealed to the Agriculture Manager, whose decisions shall be final. All protests must be in writing and filed with the 4-H office within 4 hours of the conclusion of that show. The matter will be resolved by 4-H educators within 24 hours.

(h) **EXHIBITS RELEASE TIME:**

ANIMALS - release time is between 6-8:00 AM - Sunday-July 14, 2024. Any animals that leave the fairgrounds early will lose animal fair premiums and educator's endorsement to participate at NYS Fair. Exception: Market Animals may be removed immediately after sale on Friday evening of the fair. Please refer to release time on the fair schedule.

4-H YOUTH BUILDING EXHIBITS must remain in place until 6:00 a.m. the Sunday of the fair. Exhibits that are left in the buildings will be collected and taken back to the 4-H office.

(i) ANIMAL PRE-REGISTRATION FORMS - DEADLINE: JUNE 01, 2024.

All animal entries **MUST BE PRE-ENTERED on-line** by exhibitor and/or their families. See CCE website for links to click based on animal Divisions.

NON-OWNERSHIP CERTIFICATE must be properly filled out, original to Cornell Cooperative Extension office, by JUNE 01, 2024.

NON-OWNED ANIMAL(s) accompanied with a non-ownership certificate must be properly filled out, along with registration papers to prove designation.

- Beef, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep
- Dairy Goats & Meat Goats Youth may register TWO (2) non-owned Animal per species- but may only show one at the fair.
- Dairy Cattle: Youth are allowed TWO (2) non-owned dairy animals of which both can be shown, they must have met all the qualifications. Dual designation of animal(s) is not permitted. (NEW Exception as of 2020:) Dual ownership between siblings will be allowed as long as all of the following criteria are met: (A) They are bona fide siblings (sister, brother, step-sister/brother, half-sister/brother, adopted) (B) All siblings on registration paper of animal(s) are of 4-H age and regular 4-H members as of January 1st of the current year. ANIMAL PROJECT RECORD: One project record is needed for one project animal that a youth has. If showing more than one species the 4-H'ers should only pick one animal. - A continuous record should be kept on projects animals from one year to the next. Recording dates should start October 1st to Sept 30 of the current 4-H year.

All meat goats should be entered in the appropriate age classes and grouping; (fullblood/purebred or percentage) and will show together. However, line up & scoring will be divided into Boers and "All Other Breeds". All other breeds will be judged according to the standards of their respective breeds and/or characteristics of an ideal meat goat breeding for market stock.  - Rabbits & Cavies must be brought to the fair in a suitable carrying case or cage. Any exhibitor wishing to bring an animal in prior to official check in time must contact the 4-H office or the superintendent to make special arrangements.
- (c) No animal can be placed in a coop until it is checked for disease(s). Any animal found to be diseased (e.g. ear canker, snuffles, sore hocks, diarrhea) will not be accepted. Animals will be refused at the veterinarian's discretion or their designated agent and/or the superintendent.

- 4-H County Horse Rules & Regulations used for all who are participating in the Cortland Co. 4-H Horse Project.
- NYS 4-H QUALIFY SHOW ONLY YOUTH WILL RECEIVE PREMIUMS -(see general rules in front of book).All Youth Riding must be enrolled into 4-H and meet the riding evaluation – no exception!
- <u>4-H Horse shows are fun and educational</u>, and the Rules & Regulations will be poste please observe all safety measures mandated for the events. Show Secretary and volunteer staff will be allowed to make emergency decisions if rider or exhibitor does not comply. <u>ALL YOUTH RIDERS MUST BE ENROLLED INTO 4-H TO RIDE</u>.

4-H YOUTH HORSE FUN SHOW RULES

- (a) New York Livestock Health Requirements and General Rules apply.
- (b) Stabling may be an option; you will need to contact the 4-H office 2 weeks before fair.
- (c) Ribbons awarded 1-6th places
- (d) NO STALLIONS ALL EQUINE MUST BE AT LEAST <u>24 MOS OF AGE.</u>
- (e) The show committee/CCE staff have the right and discretion to make changes to create safe environment and education for all youth riders.
- (f) Negative Coggins 2023-2024 & RABIES 2024 certificates must be presented before any horse is unloaded at the fairgrounds.
- (g) All <u>youth riders must be enrolled in 4-H</u> and been reviewed/evaluated through the 4-H Horse program. All equipment must be correctly fitted and have safe attire. Child's age determined by <u>January 1st of current year</u>.

- (h) <u>**CLOVERBUDS**</u> (5 up to 8 years of age Leadline class; An Adult 18 years or older must always accompany the youth in Leadline class (unless during the evaluation review, determine differently by evaluation committee.
- (i) <u>YOUTH RIDERS</u> (8 up to 13 years of age) may ride in Walktrot classes). Age is based on age as of January 1st of current year.
- (j) <u>HELMET REQUIREMENTS</u>: YOUTH & ADULTS THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS! An approved (ASTM-SEI-1163); dated within last (5)-five years, properly fitted /secured protective helmet MUST be worn by all riders.
- (k) <u>FOOTWEAR</u> (with at least $\frac{1}{2}$ " heel) is required and the leather footwear must have at least $\frac{1}{4}$ " clearance (each side) in the stirrup for emergency quick release.
- Not allowed: wide thick sole work boots or equestrian riding sneakers.
- (1) <u>SPURS</u>: must be held on with nylon or leather straps- (slip-ons not allowed).
- (m) <u>PARENTS/VOLUNTEERS/COACHES</u>: It is important for all to understand that flip flops & Open Toe Shoes <u>are not considered</u> proper footwear in and outside of the arena while helping/interacting with youth, riders and horses.

GRAND MASTER SHOWMAN COMPETITION at the Cortland County Jr. Youth fair is one of the most prestigious honors at the fair. The contest includes the <u>Master Showman in different divisions</u>, dairy goat, meat goat, sheep, swine, dairy cattle and beef cattle.

GRAND MASTER SHOWMAN COMPETITION RULES:

- 1. Open to Master Showman from the Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Beef, Sheep, and Swine Project Areas.
- 2. In the event that a youth is selected Master Showman from more than 1 area, that youth will have the <u>option to</u> <u>choose which species</u> they will represent in the Master Showman competition. The Reserve Master Showman may have the opportunity to compete from the subsequent area.
- 3. Scoring will be as follows: 1st place = 1pt, 2nd place = 2pts, etc. The person with the lowest point tally will be named winner.
- 4. Participants may only win twice within each 4-H age categories Junior ages 8-13 and Senior ages 14-19.
- 5. Participants will wear clean show outfits with closed toed shoes for contest.
