- Age of Exhibitor
- (a) <u>Boers and All Other Breeds</u> all meat goat breeds in addition to Boers are encouraged to enter. All meat goats should be entered in the appropriate age classes and grouping; (fullblood/purebred or percentage) and will show together.

However, line up & scoring will be divided into **Boers and "All Other Breeds**". All other breeds will be judged according to the standards of their respective breeds and/or characteristics of an ideal meat goat breeding for market stock. Meat Goats do not need to be registered with a breed association.

<u>Full bloods and purebreds</u> are does and doelings registered or eligible for registration as either purebreds or full bloods with a recognized meat goat breed. <u>Unregistered meat goats</u> must be tagged or tattooed with official scrapie identification.

<u>Registered meat goats</u> should be tattooed and accompanied by registration papers.

- Market Goat(s) must be owned and under the care of the exhibitor since June 1st of the current year Doe and wether kids are allowed to show in the market goat class. Exhibitors may not show market does in the market class breeding class. No bucks are allowed to show in the Market Goat Class.
- Weigh-in will be on Tuesday, July 8th, time TBD
- Market Goats must weigh no less than 45 pounds to show in either the light, medium, or heavy weight market class; market goats weighing less than 45 pounds will be placed in the feeder class and be ineligible to sell in the 4-H Market Animal Sale
- Animal health requirements must be met, including rabies vaccination no less than 21 days prior.
 Failure to do so will result in the animal being ineligible to show and sell in the sale. Scrapie tag number will be retained on file by 4-H Office after sale of the animal.

MARKET STEERS (BEEF):

- \circ Market Steers must be under the care of the exhibitor by December 1st of the previous 4-H Year
- Market Steer must be less than 24 months of age to show in the Market Beef Class
- Exhibitors may show two market steers in the Market Steer Class
- \circ Market Steer weigh-in will be on Tuesday, July 8th, time TBD
- Market Steers must weigh no less than 1,000 pounds to show in either the light, medium, or heavy weight market class; steers weighing less than 1,000 pounds will be placed in the feeder class and be ineligible to sell in the 4-H Market Animal Sale
- One market steer per exhibitor is permitted to sell in the 4-H Market Animal Sale
- Animal health requirements must be met, including rabies vaccination no less than 21 days prior.
 Failure to do so will result in the animal being ineligible to show and sell in the Market Animal Sale.

MARKET LAMB:

- Market Lamb(s) must be owned and under care of exhibitor since June 1st of the current 4-H year
- \circ No ram lambs may be shown in the market lamb class
- \circ $\;$ Exhibitors may show two market lambs in the Market Lamb Class $\;$
- Weigh-in will be on Tuesday, July 8th, time TBD
- Market Lamb must weigh between 85-150 pounds to show in either the light, medium, or heavy weight market class; lambs weighing less than 85 pounds will be placed in the feeder class and be ineligible to sell in the 4-H Market Animal Sale.
- o One market lamb per exhibitor is permitted to sell in the 4-H Market Animal Sale
- Animal health requirements must be met, including rabies vaccination no less than 21 days prior.
 Failure to do so will result in the animal being ineligible to show and sell in the sale. Scrapie tag number will be retained on file by 4-H Office after sale of the animal.

Rules and Regulations 2025 New York State Livestock Requirements & General Rules apply Age of Exhibitor



<u>All exhibitors must come on Monday, July 7th</u> – 6PM to the fairgrounds to <u>scrub and wash their cages & pens</u> and on after removal of their rabbits or cavies on Sunday, July 13^{th} to again wash and dis-assemble and putting away cages.

In past years, this has not been done and it will be a mandatory requirement to be considered as part of showing your animals!

- (a) Please NO Gerbils, Hamsters, Rats or Mice.
- (b) <u>Rabbits & Cavies must be checked in by 6 P.M. on Tuesday, July 8th</u>
 - Rabbits & Cavies must be brought to the fair in a suitable carrying case or cage. Any exhibitor wishing to bring an animal in prior to official check in time must contact the 4-H office or the superintendent to make special arrangements.
- (c) No animal can be placed in a coop until it is checked for disease(s). Any animal found to be diseased (e.g. ear canker, snuffles, sore hocks, diarrhea) will not be accepted. Animals will be refused at the veterinarian's discretion or their designated agent and/or the superintendent.
- (d) The exhibitor will be responsible for placing the rabbits and cavies in the assigned coops, and attaching the entry tag to the coop.
 - All entries will be cooped unless otherwise notified by superintendent.
 - Aquariums not allowed!
 - Entry Information <u>must be correct as to sex, class, variety, color and breed</u> or the exhibit will be disqualified from purebred class and re-directed to mixed/pet class.
- (e) Ownership as of June 1st. Rabbits must be tattooed prior to being exhibited at the fair. Rabbits must be 3 months old and meet minimum ARBA breed weight standards.
- (f) Classes will be provided for Jr. & Sr. rabbits of mixed breeds, if numbers warrant it.
- (g) Rabbits and Cavies will be judged and regarded on the Danish System, but "A.R.B.A. Standards" will be followed, **includes a long-sleeved**, white shirt to be worn.
- (h) Cavies as classified divisions: Senior (more than 2 lbs.) -Intermediate - (less than 6 mos. old /weigh between 1 lb. 6oz - 2 lbs.) Junior - (less than 4 mos. old and less than 1 lb.6 oz.).
- (i) Any animal not on the judging table when the class is called may be disqualified, per judge's discretion.
- (j) Showmanship is required for all exhibitors. Only exhibitors will be allowed in roped-off area at judging time. Ribbons and awards will be given out at judging time.
- (k) CLOVERBUDS can only show in Showmanship class and may enter only ONE animal
- (1) Entry Limit: a total of: Eight (8) Rabbits and Four (4) Cavy entries. (However, only ONE premium per breed class will be paid).
- (m) ANIMAL PROJECT RECORD one project record is needed for <u>one project animal</u> that a 4-H'er has. If showing more than one species, the 4-H'er should only pick one animal. Website: <u>http://cortland.cce.cornell.edu/4-h-</u>

- (n) NON-OWNED ANIMAL(s) accompanied with a non-ownership certificate must be properly filled out, along with registration papers to prove designation by June 1st. Youth are <u>limited to ONE (1) non-owned rabbit</u> at the fair. Website: <u>http://cortland.cce.cornell.edu/4-h-youth/cortland-jr-fair</u>
 - Youth may register TWO (2) Non-Owned Animal Rabbits- "but may only show one" at the fair.
 - A designated non-owned project animal must be shown <u>only by registered exhibitor</u> and not by youth owner.
 - Dual designation of one <u>animal is not permitted</u>.
- (o) 4-H Club signs and displays encouraged.
 - Fan must be provided by Exhibitor for their animal's comfort.
- (p) Each exhibitor must assume complete responsibility for his/her exhibit while at the fair, including care, feeding and showing -- according to show rules.
- (q) Exhibitors of Rabbits and Cavies who receive a blue ribbon will be allowed to represent the Cortland County 4-H Program at the New York State Fair 4-H Rabbit Show.

(r) In Place: Rabbits in place on Tuesday, July 8, 2025 6PM.

Released: All animals will be released on Sunday July 13, 2025 - 6:00 - 8:00 a.m.

4-H YOUTH HORSE FUN SHOW RULES

- (a) New York Livestock Health Requirements and General Rules apply.
- (b) Stabling may be an option; you will need to contact the 4-H office 2 weeks before fair.
- (c) Ribbons awarded 1-6th places
- (d) NO STALLIONS ALL EQUINE MUST BE AT LEAST <u>24 MOS OF AGE.</u>
- (e) The show committee/CCE staff have the right and discretion to make changes to create safe environment and education for all youth riders.
- (f) Negative Coggins 2024-2025 & RABIES 2025 certificates must be presented before any horse is unloaded at the fairgrounds.
- (g) All <u>youth riders must be enrolled in 4-H</u> and been reviewed/evaluated through the 4-H Horse program. All equipment must be correctly fitted and have safe attire. Child's age determined by <u>January 1st of current year</u>.
- (h) <u>**CLOVERBUDS**</u> (5 up to 8 years of age Leadline class; An Adult 18 years or older must always accompany the youth in Leadline class (unless during the evaluation review, determine differently by evaluation committee.
- (i) <u>YOUTH RIDERS</u> (8 up to 13 years of age) may ride in Walktrot classes). Age is based on age as of January 1st of current year.
- (j) <u>HELMET REQUIREMENTS</u>: YOUTH & ADULTS THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS! An approved (ASTM-SEI-1163); dated within last (5)-five years, properly fitted /secured protective helmet MUST be worn by all riders.
- (k) <u>FOOTWEAR</u> (with at least ¹/₂" heel) is required and the leather footwear must have at least ¹/₄" clearance (each side) in the stirrup for emergency quick release.
- Not allowed: wide thick sole work boots or equestrian riding sneakers.
- (1) <u>SPURS</u>: must be held on with nylon or leather straps- (slip-ons not allowed).
- (m) <u>PARENTS/VOLUNTEERS/COACHES</u>: It is important for all to understand that flip flops & Open Toe Shoes are not considered proper footwear in and outside of the arena while helping/interacting with youth, riders and horses.
